Congratulations on your decision to advance your healthcare career.

The **SEIU UHW-West & Joint Employer Education Fund Fall 2010 Catalog** includes schedules and information for the courses and workshops offered through our Career Counseling, Prerequisite/STEP (Success Through Educational Preparation), and Academic Support programs. It also includes the application for our **Fall 2010 Forgivable Loan Program (FLP)**. We hope this publication will help you identify and take the steps needed to improve your career and your quality of life, and to help you deliver the highest quality of patient care possible.

The Education Fund publishes two catalogs a year to coincide with the spring and fall semesters at participating community colleges. The services we offer address the unique needs of our participants - adult learners who work full time, have families and may be returning to school for the first time in years. Classes and trainings are offered nights and weekends at local community colleges and other facilities. Most classes are offered at little or no cost to eligible employees.

The Education Fund is funded by collectively bargained employer contributions as an education and training benefit for healthcare employees looking to advance their skills and move up the career ladder. Our programs and services are available to 79,000 hospital and nursing home bargaining unit members working for 30 participating employers throughout California and parts of Colorado, Nevada, Oregon and Washington. Last year, the Education Fund enrolled **5,059** employees in classes, workshops, and training programs. Since 2006, the Education Fund has enrolled **14,000** eligible employees and trained **5,428** for new careers, including 300 new nurses.

This catalog includes our eligibility criteria. While every effort has been made to ensure the correctness and timeliness of information it contains, changes may occur in course descriptions and schedules. ## GENERAL INFORMATION

### PURPOSE

THE SEIU UHW-WEST & JOINT EMPLOYER EDUCATION FUND provides opportunities for eligible healthcare employees to improve their skills, move up the career ladder and make a better life for themselves and their families. The Fund has three primary purposes:

1. To provide education and training opportunities for healthcare workers.
2. To enhance career advancement and employment security for healthcare workers.
3. To contribute to an increasingly excellent standard of patient care..

We offer a range of education and training benefits to eligible SEIU employees throughout California and parts of Colorado, Nevada, Oregon and Washington.

### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

In order to be eligible for Education Fund services an employee must:

- Work in a participating SEIU bargaining unit position for a contributing employer.

- Be a regular, full- or part-time employee eligible for benefits.
- Have completed his/her initial probationary period.

Applicants may also be required to meet other eligibility criteria required by their training program or educational institution.

In order to determine eligibility for some of our courses, applicants may be required to attend an **Information Session**. These sessions typically consist of a brief program overview followed by completion of application forms and time for questions. Registrants will receive advance notice of the time and location of these sessions, and be asked to bring copies of their state ID and a recent paystub.

## CORE PROGRAMS & SERVICES

(SOME PROGRAMS AND SERVICES MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE IN ALL REGIONS)

### CAREER COUNSELING SERVICES

One-on-one Career Counseling to help employees identify career goals and create a plan to achieve these goals. Workshops also are provided.

### PREREQUISITE/STEP COURSES

(SUCCESS THROUGH EDUCATIONAL PREPARATION)

Science and other prerequisites for nursing and allied health programs, including Biology, Anatomy & Physiology, and Microbiology as well as, Math, English and Computer skills to help build students' academic success. The program consists of a series of these classes that begin with English and math and then take the participant through the core science classes.

### ACADEMIC SUPPORT WORKSHOPS

To help adult learners succeed in college and on the job. Includes exam preparation, academic success workshops, science bridge courses, and tutoring.

## FORGIVABLE LOAN PROGRAM (FLP)

For eligible employees enrolled in Registered Nurse, Professional, Technical or other Allied Health programs. Allows employees to reduce hours of work (up to 8 per week) to attend school and study. Average payment is \$4,500 per year per student. Loan funds don't have to be repaid by recipients who move into upgrade positions and continue to work with their current employer for a specified time period, or meet other requirements. If these requirements are not met, then the loan must be repaid.

### CAREER UPGRADE PROGRAMS

Based on employer needs and designed to help employees move into high-demand, hard-to fill positions such as Registered Nurse, Certified Phlebotomy Technician, Sterile Processing Technician, Surgical Technician, Medical Coder and Mammographer.

### JOB-TO-JOB TRAINING

Provides short-term training for employees at risk of layoff. This program is intended to retrain workers for other open positions with the same employer.

## CAREER COUNSELING

**EDUCATION FUND COUNSELORS** are available in all of our regions to help you plan and take the next steps to career advancement. Services include:

- 1. CAREER ASSESSMENTS** to identify your current skills and interests in key areas and determine which career is the best match for you.
- 2. EDUCATION PLANNING** to find local programs that will help you get the education and training you need, and to identify financial resources to pay for it.

- 3. JOB SEARCH ASSISTANCE** to help you navigate the job search process, write your resume, and prepare for interviews.

Obtaining Career Counseling is as simple as asking a quick question through an email to scheduling an appointment for a face-to-face meeting or a phone call. Counselors can help you identify which Education Fund program is right for you, find out which jobs are 'in demand' with your employer, and how to move into a new position once you complete school and/or training.

Develop the attitude and the answers needed to make a strong first impression in a job interview. Build confidence in preparation for the big day. Practice time-honored interview techniques and develop customized answers to common questions. Receive resume tips and best practices.

#### **EXPLORING YOUR CAREER PATH**

Find out what type of job is the best match for your skills, interests, values, and lifestyle. Learn the steps in the career-change process, and identify in-demand jobs in the healthcare field. Appointments for individual

career counseling will be available after the session so that you can make a plan to reach your goals.

#### **HOW TO PAY FOR SCHOOL: FINANCIAL AID, EMPLOYER RESOURCES, AND MONEY MANAGEMENT**

Learn the financial resources available from your employer, the Education Fund, your union, federal and state student aid, and private scholarships. Find out where to get information and how to apply. Review money management tips to help make ends meet while in school.

## PREREQUISITE/STEP PROGRAM

The Education Fund partners with local community colleges to provide eligible employees with better access to prerequisite classes. These classes are provided in a series that begins with English and math and takes students through the entire sequence of science prerequisite classes necessary for entry into nursing, technical, professional or other allied health programs.

Courses include the core sciences, which are often impacted by high demand and short supply, such as Biology, Anatomy and Physiology, and Microbiology as well as Computer Fundamentals. Courses are offered nights and weekends in all of our regions at no charge to eligible employees. Participants also received career counseling, tutoring and other academic support.

## PREREQUISITE/STEP

### COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

#### INTRODUCTION TO

#### TO COLLEGE ENGLISH (Writing Fundamentals)

Focuses on paragraph structure and development and introduces the formal essay. Enables the student to review and improve grammar, usage, and punctuation skills while employing critical thinking strategies and the writing process to respond to a wide variety of writing situations.

#### PREPARATION FOR

#### COLLEGE ENGLISH (Basic Composition)

Emphasizes critical thinking as students explore writing for specific purposes and audiences. Students develop skills required for college-level writing while reviewing paragraph structure and focusing on essay development.

#### COLLEGE ENGLISH (English Composition)

Emphasizes the planning, writing, and revising of

compositions, including the development of critical and logical thinking skills. Includes a minimum of five compositions that stress analytical, evaluative, and persuasive/argumentative writing.

#### PRE-ALGEBRA

Further the study of fractions and mixed numbers. Also included are vocabulary, operations and applications of ratio, proportion, percent, area, perimeter, US and metric measures, integers, and an introduction to algebraic expressions and the solution of basic first-degree equations.

#### ELEMENTARY ALGEBRA (Introductory Algebra)

Includes first-degree equations, inequalities, formulas; polynomials; algebraic fractions, factoring polynomials, solving quadratic equations by factoring and applications. Coordinate geometry, graphing linear equations and inequalities, and systems of linear equations may be included.

**BIOLOGY** (General College Biology I with Lab)

Examines the fundamental molecular, cellular and genetic principles characterizing plants and animals. Includes cell structure and function, and the metabolic processes of respiration, and photosynthesis, as well as cell reproduction and basic concepts of heredity. The course includes laboratory experience.

**ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY I**

Focuses on an integrated study of the human body including the histology, anatomy, and physiology of each system. Examines molecular, cellular, and tissue levels of organization plus integuments, skeletal, articulations, muscular, nervous systems and special senses. Includes a mandatory hands-on laboratory experience covering experimentation, microscopy, observations, and dissection. This is the first semester of a two-semester sequence.

**ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY II**

Focuses on the integrated study of the human body and the histology, anatomy, and physiology of the following systems and topics: endocrine, cardiovascular, hematology, lymphatic and immune, urinary, fluid and electrolyte control, digestive, nutrition, respiratory, reproductive, and development. Includes a mandatory hands-on laboratory experience involving experimentation, microscopy, observations, and dissection. This is the second semester of a two-semester sequence.

**MICROBIOLOGY**

Examines microorganisms with an emphasis on their structure, development, physiology, classification, and identification. The laboratory experience includes culturing, identifying, and controlling microorganisms with an emphasis on their role in infectious disease.

## ACADEMIC SUPPORT

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This program aims to bridge the gap from where students are to where they need to be in order to succeed in their classes and career advancement efforts. Extra support such as tutors and study groups are provided for those enrolled in Education Fund science prerequisite and other classes.

Among the offerings are Bridge Courses, big picture, four-week overviews of the science classes required for nursing or allied health programs. These overview courses typically are offered shortly before the semester starts and help students brush up on the particular skills they'll need in the science course.

## ACADEMIC SUPPORT

### COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

#### MICROBIOLOGY BRIDGE

Connects the role of microbes in human illness including the study of microbial pathogenesis and epidemiology as it relates to the study of disease pathology and immunology. Re-enforces students' practice in critical thinking skills in the study of reproduction and growth of microbes. Fills in the basics (e.g. basic chemistry of life processes in microbes). Bolsters students' content knowledge before entering Microbiology.

**Course duration:** 20 hours

**Please note:** Students accepted into the Microbiology course at Community College of Aurora will receive information about the Microbiology Bridge Course.

## **FORGIVABLE LOAN**

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

#### **For Registered Nurse, Allied Health Professional and Technical Education**

This program allows eligible employees to take time off of work with pay to attend school. Loans are available to eligible employees enrolled in nursing or allied health degree programs at accredited institutions. Recipients are compensated to reduce their work schedule by up to 8 hours a week for school attendance and to study.

The loan doesn't have to be paid back if the recipient moves into an upgraded position and continues to work with their current employer for a year or more and/or meets other requirements. If these requirements are not met, then the loan must be repaid.

*Please note: The program is not for completion of prerequisites.*

### **ELIGIBLE PROGRAMS**

The program covers nursing and allied health training programs. We are considering applications from students in the following programs: Licensed Practical

Nurse, Registered Nurse, Respiratory Therapy, Radiologic Technology and Surgical Technician. Other programs may be considered.

Additional requirements:

- Degree program generally should be one or more years in length.
- The academic institution must be accredited by a relevant accrediting body.
- The program must prepare you for a job your employer has determined to be in demand.
